ALTAR SERVER (*Grade 3 thru High School & Adult – family participation invited*)

The primary role of the altar server is to assist the priest during the Mass. This involves properly setting and clearing the Altar table, helping to receive the gifts of bread and wine, lighting and extinguishing the candles, reverently participating in the procession and recessional, and other miscellaneous needs determined by the liturgy celebration. In order for an altar server to be successful, they must be willing to understand the order of Mass and have a desire to actively participate by singing, praying, responding and listening. Certainly encouragement and a commitment from the parents will help to build responsible, reverent and dedicated servers.

Altar Server Training: Monday, September 14th from 6:00 – 8:00pm.

GREETER (*recommended for families and/or Middle & High School teams*)

As part of the Hospitality Ministry, a greeter will display a genuine welcome and share a smile with the faith community as they come to prepare for worship. Greeters will be positioned inside the sanctuary entrance and will distribute Missalettes & Worship Aids.

USHER (*Middle School thru Adult*)

As part of the Hospitality Ministry, an usher will help with the collection during the preparation of the gifts and will assist the community during the communion procession. Ushers are always available to meet the needs of parishioners and provide any necessary assistance or information.

LECTOR (*Middle School thru Adult*)

Proclaiming the scripture requires a desire to know and understand more deeply our Catholic faith. A lector will be eager to live a Gospel way of life by following the teachings of Jesus. On a practical matter, a clear speaking voice, good posture and reverence, and a commitment to diligent preparation is very important.

EUCCHARISTIC MINISTER (*must be at least 16 years old*)

As an Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion, a Eucharistic Minister helps to distribute the Body and Blood of Christ to the faith community. Great care, reverence and understanding of the Eucharist are needed in order to accept the full responsibility of this ministry. Additionally, a Eucharistic Minister will be eager to “share” Jesus with others, not only at church but in all activities in everyday life.

CHOIR (*Elementary, Youth and Adult*)

All are welcome! Giving God glory and praise through song is not only fun but can be very prayerful, joyful, encouraging and exciting – it truly can bring fulfillment to one’s spiritual formation. Generally, choir opportunities are available at Christmas and/or Easter liturgies.

CANTOR/INSTRUMENTALIST (*Middle School thru Adult*)

Participation in Music Ministry can be very flexible, but often times quite diverse and demanding. Opportunities will vary according to the skill, experience and commitment of those interested. Furthermore, liturgy needs and specific celebrations will determine the extent to when, who, and how often the involvement of musicians is required.
